Set Thunderbird to Delete Old Emails Automatically

OPTION A: Remove Old Mail Automatically From a Folder

To make Mozilla Thunderbird delete old emails in a specific folder (such as JUST your Sent folder or JUST your Inbox) automatically:

- 1. Click on the desired folder with the right mouse button.
- 2. Select **Properties**... from the menu.
- 3. Go to the **Retention Policy** tab.
- 4. Make sure Use server defaults or Use my account settings is not checked.
- 5. Check either **Delete all but the most recent** <u>messages</u> (or **Delete all but the last** <u>messages</u>) or **Delete messages more than** <u>days old</u>.
- 6. Typically, make sure **Always keep starred messages** is checked; this allows for an easy way to preserve emails.
- 7. Enter the desired time or message count.
 - Keeping about 30 days or 100 messages in a **Trash** folder usually works fine.
 - Even for something like your default inbox, 90 days can work well.
- 8. Click **OK**.

OPTION B: Remove Old Mail Automatically for an Entire Email Account

To set a default policy for an account that has Mozilla Thunderbird delete old emails across folders in the account:

- 1. Select **Preferences** > **Account Settings** from the Mozilla Thunderbird menu.
- 2. You can also select **Tools** > **Account Settings** from the menu.
- 3. Go to the **Synchronization & Storage** category for the desired account in the **Account Settings** window.
- 4. Make sure you checked **Delete all but the most recent** <u>messages</u> or **Delete** messages more than <u>days old</u>.
- 5. If you are prompted:

Click OK in the Confirm permanent, automatic deletion of messages dialog.

- Do keep in mind that **messages you did want to keep may inadvertently be deleted** with this setting; do, perhaps, not rely on your starring messages to retain them.
- At the same time, chances are you will not miss any messages older than, say, a year that have been permanently deleted.
- You can adapt the default settings for any individual folder to either keep more or less mail or to turn off automatic deletion altogether; see above (option A).
- 6. Click **OK**.
